As natural and manmade shocks and stresses increasingly affect cities around the world, local governments are facing the necessity to plan for and react to a wide range of hazards. Resilience building in the local context is becoming an integral component of cities' action plans. As a result of resilience building, cities are better prepared to protect and enhance people's lives, foster an investible environment and drive positive change.

The session will introduce the audience to the work of ICLEI and specifically to its Resilient Development Pathway. During the session, best local resilience practices and lessons learned both from the Global South and North will be presented and analyzed. The discussion on building resilience in cities will be followed by the expert contribution from an ICLEI partner and Resilient Cities Congress Exhibitor, <u>KIT – Innovation Hub</u>, on solutions for cities with the specific focus on resilient and adaptive infrastructure and the concept of prevention in construction. The round of presentations will be concluded by another partner

organization and active member of the Bonn Network for Disaster Risk Reduction – <u>DKKV</u>, focusing on DKKV's contribution to the <u>Resilient Cities 2019 Congress</u> and providing an insight into the collaboration with the City of Bonn. The second part of the session will aim to provide a space for the Q&A from the audience and will be concluded by a small reception with refreshments.
