OBJECTIVE

The rapid urbanization coupled with changing climate calls for an innovative and integrated approach to efficiently manage the limited resources specially water, food and energy. There is a greater need of building urban resilience by focusing on trade-offs and synergies thereby enhancing resource use efficiency and improved policy coherence. The Urban Nexus approach applies to the management of resources at the city level and serves as an ideal entry point to addressing landmark global agendas adopted in 2015 and 2016, mainly the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, the Paris Climate Agreement and the New Urban Agenda. Both, i.e., global agendas and the nexus approach promote synergies and the use of innovative policies and technologies to achieve co-benefits.

The session primarily drew from lessons and insights in the implementation of the regional project, GIZ Integrated Resource Management in Asian Cities: The Urban Nexus funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). The project is implemented by GIZ in cooperation with ICLEI - Local Governments for Sustainability and UNESCAP as political partner. The project applies a multi-level and multi sectoral approach supporting twelve cities in seven countries in Asia including China, India, Indonesia, Mongolia, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam, respective national level authorities and ministries as well as the academia in developing cross-sectoral infrastructure projects.

OUTCOMES

Participants gain understanding and appreciated the importance of integration across jurisdictions and sectors required to optimize resources and develop co-benefits; challenges with respect to horizontal and vertical integration, financial constraints and role of local governments in contributing to the different global agendas.



METHODOLOGY

- The facilitator opened the session with a short introduction and overview of the session. **(15 minutes)**
- ICLEI gave an overview for the entire project, challenges, outcomes and achievements. **(20 minutes)**
- City leaders/representative from project cities presented their experiences and challenges while adopting a nexus approach across the various dimensions of governance; inclusive-decision making; urban planning; finance/business practices; and science, technology and innovation dimensions via guided questions. **(30 minutes)**
- The facilitator managed questions and answers from the audience. **(15 minutes)**
- The host concluded with closing remarks. **(10 minutes)**
