OBJECTIVE

Build an inclusive conversation involving city representatives, practitioners and insurance to jointly develop a roadmap for boosting the implementation of Integrated Climate Risk Management (ICRM) frameworks in different urban contexts, in line with the Insurance Industry Development Goals for Cities.

- Increase awareness of local governments about the importance of **ICRM** frameworks and the investments required vs. the potential benefits. Socialize the role of cost-effective risk transfer solutions on 1) supporting the assessment and quantification of risks, 2) engaging with and promoting investments in risk reduction and preparedness and 3) coping with residual risks.
- Highlight the opportunities of collaboration between the insurance industry and cities to reduce vulnerability and promote sustainability.
- Socialize the cross-sectoral advantages and opportunities of targeting the Insurance Industry Development Goals for Cities for disaster risk management and in general for improving urban resilience and sustainability.
- Present the vision and underlying ambitions of the **InsuResilience Global Partnership** until 2025, as an overarching global platform for climate risk finance and insurance with the potential to mobilize and upscale resilience efforts for cities.

OUTCOMES

The session was designed as a platform for exchanging knowledge between practitioners from the insurance industry and city representatives. The discussion allowed participants to:

- a. Measure the level of insurance literacy within the group.
- b. Poll on the current role of risk transfer solutions in Disaster Risk Management (DRM).
- c. Identify the most common reasons for the limited role of insurance products in DRM.
- d. Identify the most common misconceptions around insurance products from city representatives and other participants.
- e. Breakdown misconceptions and clarify the limitations and challenges of insurance products by practitioners and insurance experts.
- f. Identify the risk transfer needs of the participant cities and the corresponding expectations towards the insurance industry.
- g. Breakdown how the insurance industry can design and implement solutions that build on and promote ICRM frameworks in urban contexts, with tangible co-benefits between the various risk management components.
- h. Identify and involve the partners and stakeholders needed for the enabling environment and the development of solutions.
- i. Build a roadmap to design and implement new or strengthen existent ICRM frameworks in the participant cities, including tailor-made risk transfer solutions.

METHODOLOGY

The session was divided into four main segments.

- Welcome Address: Setting the scene. (20 minutes)
- Debate segment: Are cities prepared to cope with climate risks? Why are most urban climate risk management frameworks half-backed? (40 minutes)
- Q&A segment: the audience takes a sit in the conversation. (30 minutes)
