OBJECTIVE

As one of the most urbanized continents in the world, resilience building in South America faces common challenges across the region, such as intensified population growth, shelter precariousness and environmental degradation. This leads to pressures on cities and, consequently, to local governance, that needs to take into account local specificities and diversity among each context while mainstreaming international frameworks. At the same time, climate change aggravates vulnerabilities and adds significant environmental, socioeconomic and administrative pressures on each national context.

At the same time, South America is a vital hotspot for biodiversity with relevant concentration of assets of global importance that have the capacity to support sustainability and resilience building. However, this is threatened if ecosystem services are not protected. Recent global assessments show that South American regional is especially vulnerable to the loss of biodiversity, having already lost a considerable number of species.

This panel session aimed to provide a platform for reflection and discussion on how to strengthen environmental management, integrate biodiversity and promote nature-based solutions as a way to build long term resilience in the South American context while also promoting environmental benefits worldwide. As an outcome, this session aimed at collecting perceptions and proposing a shared vision for South American local development plans towards the new Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework.

OUTCOMES

The key outcomes of this panel were:

- To collect perceptions and propose a shared vision for South American local development plans towards the new Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework;
- To provide a regional overview of common challenges regarding resilience building in the South American context;
- To enable the exchange of experiences concerning environmental management, biodiversity integration and nature-based solutions towards resilience building;
- To identify good practices in terms of strategies for coping with climate vulnerability;
